#### **Present Perfect Form**

## Regular verbs

TO HAVE + V+ ED (PAST PART.)

- I have opened
- You have danced
- He/she/it has stopped
- We have studied
- You have played
- They have waited

# **Irregular verbs**

- TO HAVE + PAST PART (3°C)
- I have drunk
- You have found
- He/she/it has run
- We have sent
- You have bought
- They have worn

## **NEGATIVES**

- I have not drunk

# Concept

• THE PRESENT PERFECT IS A LINE WHICH CONNECTS THE PAST TO THE PRESENT:

PAST

**HOW LONG** 

**PRESENT** 



## **USAGE**

- Action of the past that is still going on
- Example: School has not started yet
- Action that stopped recently
- Example: She has cooked dinner.
- Finished action in the past that has an influence on the present
- Example: I have lost my key.
- Action that has taken place once, never or several times before the moment of speaking.
- Example: I have never been to Australia.



### SIMPLE PAST CONCEPT

The Simple past is a dot:



• It refers to concluded actions. WHEN the action ended. Always found with adverbs of time.



#### **TIPS**

• Before you understand how to use the P.P. tense, it is of great help to remember that the P.P. is always found with the following adverbs:

already, ever, just, never, not yet, so far, till now, up to now, recently, lately, today, this week, this year, this month, since, for.

#### **EXAMPLES**

- PAST Helen left yesterday
- P.P Helen has just left.
- PAST I watched that movie yesterday
- P.P. I have not watched it yet
- PAST He popped out few minutes ago
- P.P. He has just popped out.
- PAST He visited London last month
- P.P. Have you ever visited London?
